Dear Friends,

One of the things I have really enjoyed about learning the history of Salem is seeing how the church worked to handle the many and different changes of the past 101 years. It seems to me that one of the needs now is community. As we move into autumn, let us think of ways to practice good and healthy community, and invite our neighbors into it. Maybe some movie nights? Potluck dinner and game night? Open mic talent show? Chili cook-off?

Salem has a wonderful, warm, caring community. I believe this is something a lot of our neighbors could use right about now.

### **COUNCIL CORNER**

And just like that fall is upon us and we are in the middle of a busy season at church. The choirs are back, and Christian education has resumed for all ages. We have started our stewardship campaign and will be finishing up our capitol campaign this month.

I am sure you are finding it easier to know where to park as the parking lot project has been completed. I was at the church almost every day while the work was being done and it was quite the project. Tri County Paving is a very professional group and does great work.

The first day of the project, Tri County removed the old blacktop. The next job was to determine the integrity of the foundation of the parking lot. We had anticipated that we could have some foundation that needed replacement, but this is where we ran into a big issue. All the bids we had included the removal and replacement of the black top, but not the replacement of the foundation.

Tri County determined that we needed to replace the entire foundation of the parking lot. I was on site as they were rolling a full dump truck over every foot of the area and watching the ground roll. In some places we had 4 inches of foundation, in some areas we had none. The foundation should be 15 inches. The bill and the work involved in doing this doubled the price of the parking lot.

That same night we had a special council meeting, including members of the building and grounds committee. We reviewed the situation, and the council voted to move forward with replacing the foundation.

As Tri County did this work, they brought in the large excavator and took out about 190 loads of dirt and replaced it with 190 loads of foundation. That was a lot of earth being moved.

This was a big and costly project, but I am confident that we now have a very solid foundation for the parking area that will last a long, long time.

The capital campaign to fund this project is underway and I am happy to report that we already have some significant contributions. The campaign is going to run through October 15 when we have asked for all the pledge cards to be returned, and we will tally and reveal the results. Please prayerfully consider your contribution to this campaign.

We have been through a lot of foundation changes in the last few years at Salem. Much of it has been difficult, some of the work is ongoing but we have been working hard and trying to build a solid foundation. I think that we have been doing that. We are literally and figuratively Paving the Way Forward for our future, and we need your continued help.
